

CSAH 34 (Birch Street) Improvements – Anoka County



Project Overview:

The CSAH 34 Reconstruction project for Anoka County is located in Lino Lakes on Birch Street (CSAH 34) and is roughly one mile in length. It is a staged construction project with two main stages and two intermediate stages. The project consists of modifying the existing roadway from a rural section to an urban section. The new urban section will include a center median for a length of the project as well as two roundabouts. The project will consist of full depth reclamation, watermain/services, storm sewer, new ponds, new parking lot, and trail construction. All of this work will take place in 2021 with the majority of it happening while school is out of session from June through August.

- Aggregates
- Site Utilities
- Asphalt Paving
