**Project Profile:
Carver Elementary School
Independent School District 622**



Project Overview:

Park Construction was awarded the Site work, Utilities, Asphalt Paving, and Building Demolition package for the Carver Elementary School additions and renovations project in Maplewood, MN. This project included the demolition of a 24,000 SF existing wing of an elementary school and the construction of two new additions, three new parking lots, a bus/parent drop-off loop, and a new playground area.

Work Scope: Sitework/Earthwork, Utilities, Asphalt Paving, Building Demolition, Site Concrete, Landscaping, and Fencing.

Project Contract Amount: \$2,930,000.00

Duration: Spring of 2020 – Spring of 2022

Estimated Quantities & Project Highlights:

- Earthwork operations moved roughly 40,000 CY of material on site.
- Park installed 1,200 LF of 60" perforated corrugated metal pipe that serves as the underground stormwater infiltration system to assist on site water management.
- Park utility crews installed:
 - 412 LF of sanitary sewer
 - 700 LF of water services
 - 4,400 LF of storm sewer

- Excavation of over 2,200 LF of frost footings and 85 structural pads.
- This project includes a Biofiltration detention basin filled with engineered soils to help filtrate clean water into the ground.
- The basin contains 6 different types of trees and shrubs equaling 212 total plantings.
